was unveiled today by the State Division of Parks.

The revision was the result of pressure brought to bear by the CPPP, (Citizens for the Preservation of Private Prpoerty) an organization of local homesteaders who own property located within the original park boundaries.

Approximately 15,343 acres of land are now outside the

limits of thepark.

Public hearings on the new boundaries have been scheduled for June 29th at 8pm in the Z.J. Loussac Library in Anchorage, with local hearings to be scheduled in Eagle River and in Girdwood at a later date.

EAGLE RIVER: Negotiation for the purchase of the Broadwater Building in Eagle River by the Borough ground to a halt when it was discovered that no bank in the Anchorage Area would lend the funds necessary to complete the transaction.

The Borough Assembly had, earlier in the year, approved the purchase of the Broadwater Building to be converted into a community center for this area.

The restrictive terms of the ordinance, however, limited the method of financing the project to a loan from an Alaskan lending institution, with the money to be repaid over a ten year period from revenue received from rent als of office space in the building.

Ed Willis, local Assemblyman, said that the refusal of any banks to cke the loan was totally unexpected.

The estimated gross cont from organizations which would be using the building is over \$24,000 per year, enough to repay \$180,000,00 which the Borough needed to purchase the building and make the necessary repairs and alterations, plus interest.

Willis stated that one slim chance for a loan still was in the offing. They had not vet heard from the Alaska National Bank, a Fairbanks based institution.

The original ordinance had called for the project to be financed by the Borough Land Trust Fund, This was blocked by Assemblyman from the City of Anchorage, who substituted the present ordinance.

Many moetings have been held in past works between the Botourt Administration, Ed Willis and Bob Broadwater, owner of the building trying to find a way out of the difficulties.

Broadwater had given the Borough a June 5th deadline to complete the transaction, He has since extended this, Willis said.

A spokesman for the Borough Administration pointed out that Broadwater has been willing since easly in January for the Borough to complete the transaction. That he is in need of the money from the sale of the building to finance his plastics manufacturing plant in Palmer, and that it would be unfair and unrealistic to expect him to wait indefinitely.

Willis commented that the Community Center ordinance had been based entirely on the purchase of the Broadwater Building, and if that ceases

affected private property owners had the park boundary not been changed.

to be available, it will be a whole new ballgame. Another building in the area would have to be located, and if none was available, then acerage on which to construct one would have to be purchased.

Willis mentioned an alternate possibility which would not rule out the Broadwater Building, This would be a lease-purchase method, such as the Borough has utilized in the past for the location of agencies such as libraries.

This would, however have to go back to the Assembly for approval,

Agencies which are walting to move into the Community Center are, the Eagle River Volunteer Fire Company, the Borough Health Department. Borough Sewer Maintenance offices, Department of Enviornmental Quality, Animal Control and GOAL. The Owl Cafe, which is presently located in the building would continue to lease space.




This event kicked off the summer racing season at the Ice Palace, which has installed tracks for both stock car and cycle racing.




