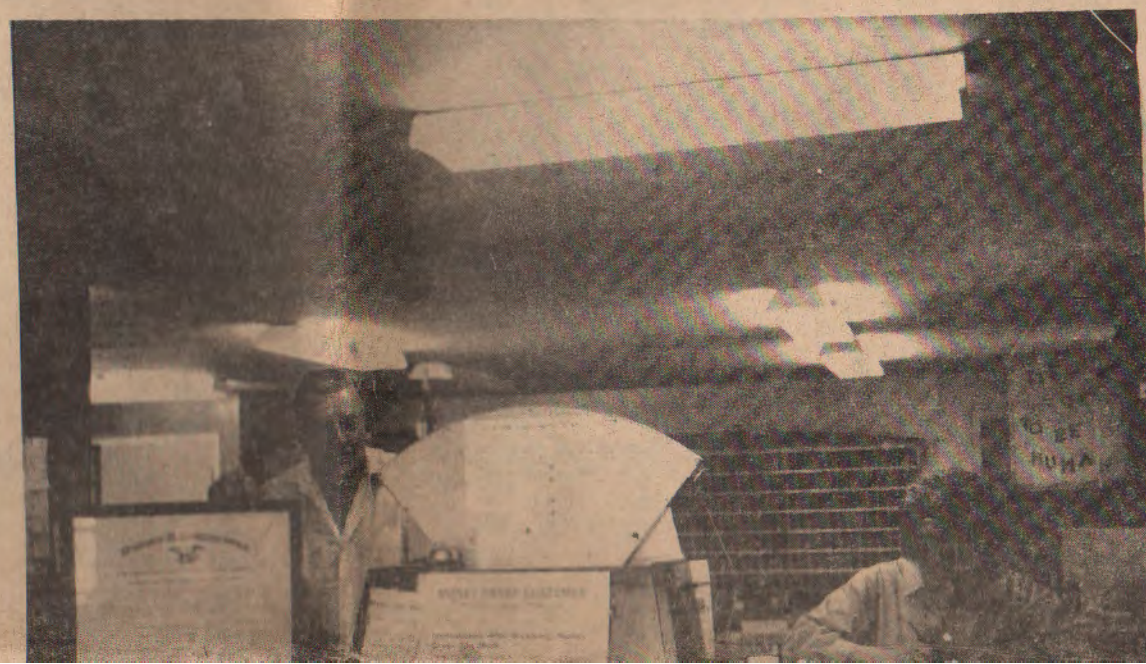
### REAPPORTIONMENT ... NOTHING TO DO BUT WAIT AND WORRY

**CHUGIAK:** Wait and wonder... that is the name of the game for the residents of the Greater Chugiak Area, as the Governor's appeal of the Supreme Court's reapportionment plan makes its way through the legal mill.

With the decision of the Governor to appeal the plan through the office of the attorney general, the local citizens have decided not to appeal on their own, but to al-

### CBA TO ASK AUTHORIZATION TO CHANGE BY-LAWS

**OLD CHUGIAK:** Members of the Chugiak Benefit Association will be asked to approve a change in the By-Laws of CBA at the annual meeting to be held Thursday, July 13th.



**OLD CHUGIAK:** The Chugiak Post Office officially became a 2nd class facility as of Saturday, July 1st, according to Paul Swanson Postmaster.

An increase in the population of the area served by the Post Office as reflected by box rentals, sales of stamps etc. was the basis for the upgrading.

The Chugiak Post Office was originally commissioned as a 4th class facility in 1947. At that time it was located at the Moosehorn Trading Post, with Marie McDowell, proprietor of Moosehorn the Postmaster.

The Postoffice was moved to Swanee Slopes in 1955 when Swanson became the Postmaster. At that time it was a 3rd class post office.

As post office business increased, it was moved from the original location at Swanee Slopes to a larger adjacent

izens have decided not to appeal on their own, but to allow the Attorney General to represent their case.

While the prime basis of the Governor's appeal is on the legality of including the military population, he has also included the dividing of areas which have been traditionally socio-economic units.

Ed Willis, local Borough Assemblyman, who has headed up the local citizens group, said that all the information this group had put together for an appeal is a matter of public record and is available to the Federal Court if they should require it to help them arrive at a decision.

It has been announced by the office of the Lt. Governor that the appeal should in no way cause any delay in conducting the primary election in August. This election could, however, be conducted under one of three reapportionment plans; the one drawn up by the State Supreme Court which is now being appealed; the plan submitted by Governor Egan which the Supreme Court overthrew, or the plan drawn up in 1965 and which was used in the last election.

No indication has been given as to how soon a judgement will be forthcoming from the U.S. Supreme Court to whom the appeal was directed.

CBA at the annual meeting to be held Thursday, July 13th.

The change will be to Article V Section 3 of the By-Laws which would be changed to read "Officers shall be elected at a regular annual meeting held in the fall of each year."

At present the Annual meeting is scheduled for the month of July. The Board of Directors feel that the press of summer activities has been largely responsible for the poor turnout at the annual meetings and believe that a better representation would be forthcoming if the meeting date were changed to the fall months.

The date of the fall election will be set at the July 13th meeting pending ratification of the By-law changed by the membership.

The July 13th meeting will be held at the Chugiak Senior Center, Mile 21 Old Glenn Highway, starting at 8:00pm.

To be eligible as a voting member of CBA, one must be a resident for 30 days or longer of any of the communities of the Greater Chugiak Area. This includes, Eagle River, Fire Lake, Birchwood, Old Chugiak, Peters Creek and Eklutna. All persons age 13 or older who meet the above residence qualifications are considered to be members of the Chugiak Benefit Association and are eligible to vote in the election.

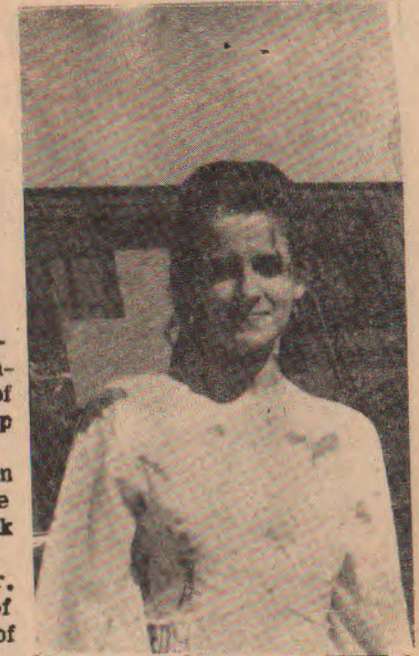
At this time there are 450 post office boxes rented at Chugiak and over 200 patrons on the Star Route.

## "REAPPORTIONMENT" ANOTHER DIRTY WORD

"Reapportionment"....not too long ago this phrase held out hope that this area would gain their own representative in Juneau.... now it is almost as distasteful a word as "Unification".

With the community split as it has been by the Alaska Supreme Court's reapportionment plan, the growing power which this area was beginning to exert in local and State Government has been effectively silenced.

While it is difficult to believe that an august body such as the Alaska Supreme Court would be guilty of deliberately splitting this community to weaken it politically, some of the more militant citizens of the area are convinced that this must be why it happened.

True, it does give one pause to consider that the one who was responsible for the original plan of Governor Egan being overthrown by the Supreme Court was State Senator Cliff Groh, who can hardly have too many kind thoughts about the residents of the area, who rejected the chart-

True to form, the Anchorage news media are misinterpreting the reactions of the residents of this area over the split. They are picturing the residents of the areas which are now in the Mat Su legislative District as being unhappy at being separated from Anchorage, while the ones in Eagle River and Fire Lake, who are still part of Anchorage Northeast as without any problems. They completely ignore the truth, which is that the people of both these areas are unhappy over being divided, and would not care if they were all put in Mat-Su, as long as they were not divided.

The side effects of this split could be numerous and continue to cause problems for local residents long after the election.

The fact that the Peters Creek Chugiak and Birchwood areas would still be a part of the Greater Anchorage Area Borough, while being in the Mat-Su could create any number of problems, as the GAAB is quite concerned with. For

## LADIES CLUB MEETING IS POSTPONED

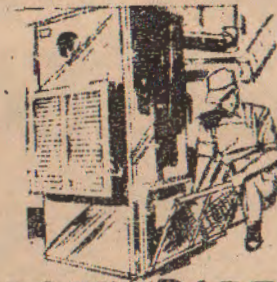



the old way with a crew operating with pick and shovel and wheelbarrow, while the trailer pulled by the truck showed the new way... a modern bulldozer.

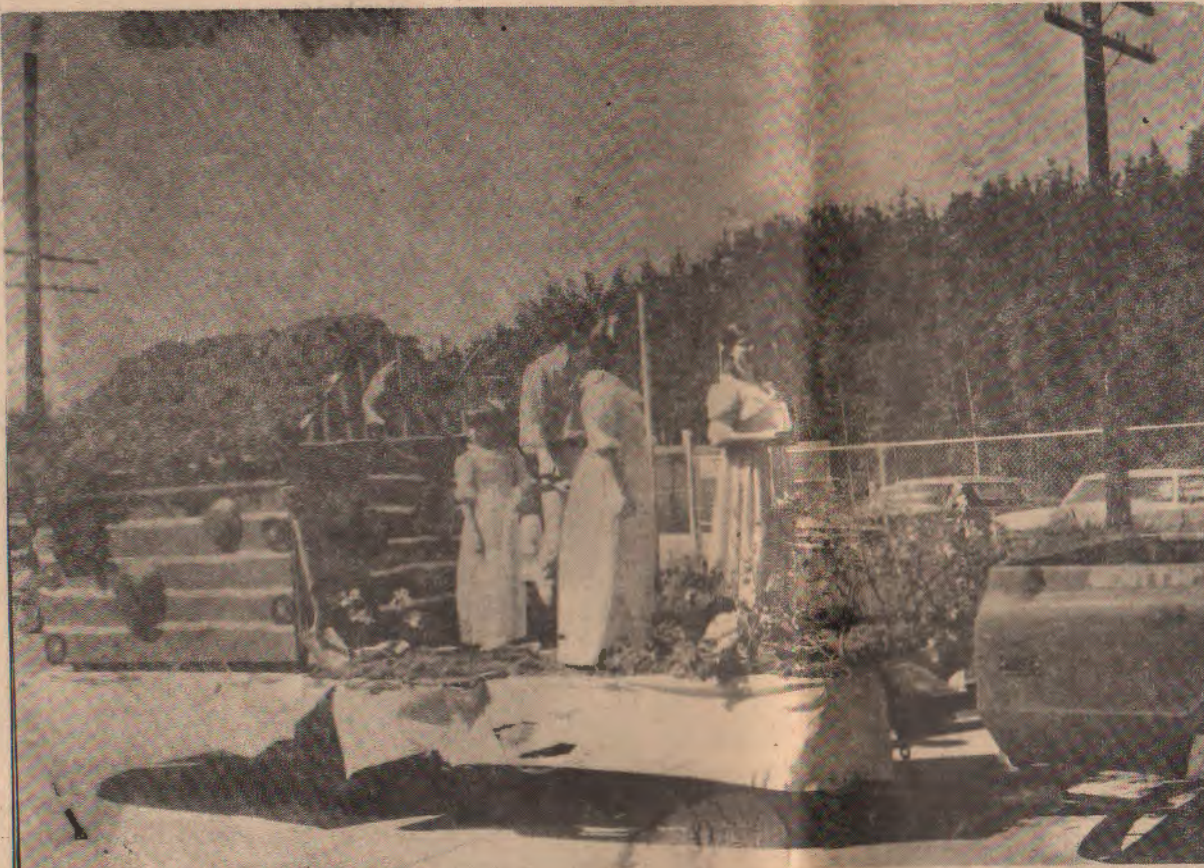

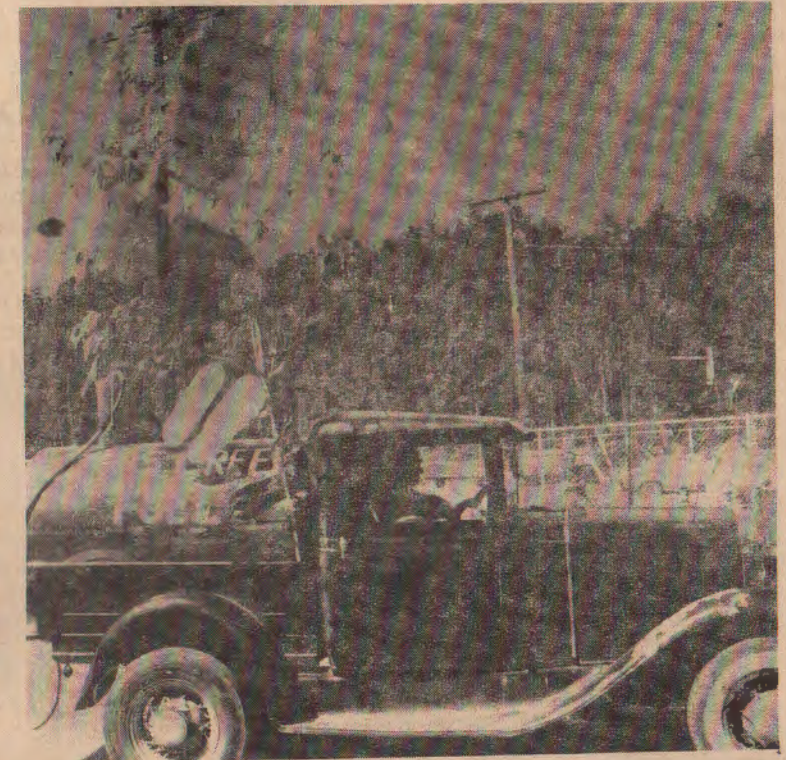

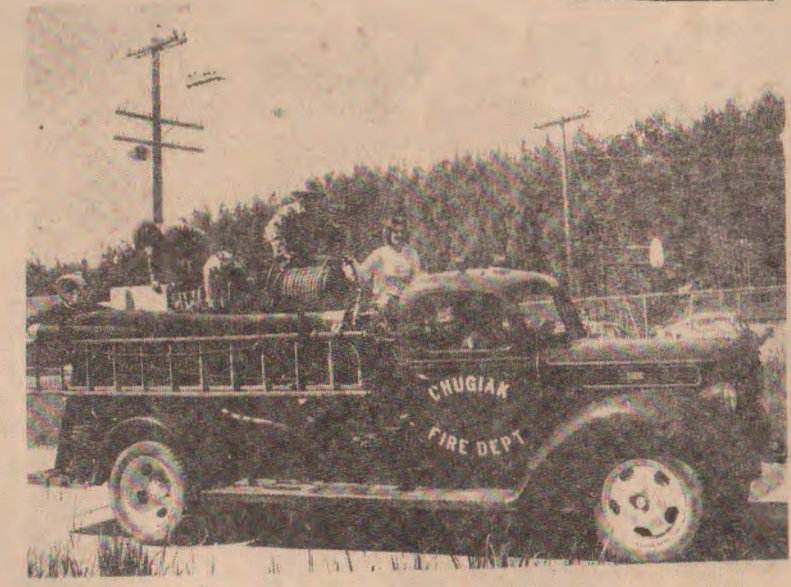
