CHUGIAK: A survey, to determine specific needs of the residents of the Greater Chugiak Area is being conducted by the Greater Anchorage Ar a Borough Health Department in conjunction with the newly established Family Service Center.

This Center was established on August 1sc, of this year to serve the residents of the Greater Chugiak Area by meeting the needs of the people where those needs exist.

Although many health and social services are already available, many resources could be provided if the needs of the community were better known.

CHUGIAK: Bob Kallenberg, Candidate for the State House of Representatives from District 6, appears to be well out in front, and stands a good chance of capturing the GOP side of the ballot, as 26 out of 29 precincts reported in as of press time.

In the oeverall tally Kallen berg had a healthy lead of 343 votes over his closest GOP opponent Robert L. McCartney, who had 221 votes. Ted Schmidke, the third Repub lican candidate trailed with 201 votes.

Voter turnout in the Great er Chugiak area was about average for a primary el ection, with a total of 1312 votes cast.

FIRE CO. TO SIGN CONTRACT WITH BOROUGH

CHUGIAK: The Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company has agre d to sign a contract with the Greater Anchorage Area Borough to provide both Fire Protection and Ambulance service to the area.

The Fire Co. agreed to the contract following a meeting Director of Public Safety, Joe Maxwell and Fire Chief Bagley of the Borough at the Chugiak Fire Hall last Tues -

Apparently some mambers of the Fire Company were fearful that the Borough might step in and place pro fe ional fire fighters in the area as had been done in Eagle River.

Both Chief Bagley and Mr. Maxwell assured them that this would not happen as long as the Fire Company was willing and able to provide the nece sary service.

STILL NO WATER AT SCHOOL SITE

still not found an adequate water supply at the test well which is being drilled at the propos ed site for the new Chugiak E1ementary School.

The well is now down to 240 feet, according to a spokesman for the Greater Anchorage Borough School District.

The land, which is owned by the Chugiak Benefit Association has not yet been transferred to the School District.

A proposed exchange of that land for the property presently occupied by the existing Chugiak Elementary School is pending the outcome of the test well. The existing school site lacked sufficient water to supply the needs of the school, and the land exchange with CBA was proposed.

The site in question is locat ed at Mile 21, on the Old Glenn Highway, and includes the Chugiak Rodeo arena, the Carnival Hall and Little League ballpark.

The contract calls for the driller to go to a maximum of 400 feet in depth.

CHUGIAK: The Boroughwide public transportation system, which will be put before the voters in the form of a bond issue next October, will include the Greater Chugiak Area.

ECTION.

This was explained at the Monday meeting of the local Chamber of Commerce by Mr. Wil liam Barnes, of the Borough Transportation Committee.

Mr. Barnes spoke at length of the transportation problem in the Borough. Plans to aleviate these problems would include buses to bring people to the "inner city" in the mornings, as well as to carry them away in the evening after work, as well as some buses to provide transportation to the shoppers at specified periods through the

Bus service to the local area would probably be limited to buses departing and arriving at a terminal, located somwhere centrally, with those wishing to use the buses having to arrange their own transportation to or from the terminal.

The bus system would be op erated by the Borough, probably let out on contract, it was explained.

Funds would be derived from the bond issue as well as some subsidy ed funds from the Fed eral Government.




