### MEA GRANTED LOAN FUNDS

**PALMER:** Matanuska Electric Association has received notice from both REA and CFC that the agencies have granted a concurrent loan to the Association.

Mr. David Hamil, REA Administrator, advises that his agency has made a loan in an amount of \$2,979,00 from the Rural Electric and Telephone Revolving Fund at an interest rate of 5 percent.

Concurrently, Mr. J. K. Smith, Governor of CFC, has announced the granting of a loan in the amount of \$1,276,000. The interest rate is 7 percent. The combined loan to MEA totals \$4,255,000.

The loans were made in response to MEA's application which was filed in late June, 1973. The funds will be used by MEA for a variety of purposes including the construction of service to an estimated 1,400 new members, seven miles of transmission line, new headquarters facilities both at Palmer and Eagle River, and about 223 miles of new distribution line in various parts of MEA's service area.

This announcement comes to MEA at a very opportune time as the Association's staff is presently preparing the 1974 annual work plan in anticipation of a greatly accelerated demand for additional electric service next year as a result of the North Slope construction start-up.

# COMMUNITY CARNIVAL AT CHS THIS WEEKEND

BIRCHWOOD: The first Annual Chugiak High School Community Carnival will be opening for a two day run on Friday, November 23rd.

## "IN-SERVICE DAY TO BE OBSERVED AT CHS

BIRCHWOOD: Chugiak High School along with other secondary schools in the GAAB School District will take their first in-service Day on Monday, November 26th, under legislation providing up to 10 days out of the school year for teacher training.

Junior and senior high school teachers will meet for in-service education on goals and objectives for their respective academic areas, according to Dr. Cliff Hartman, Assistant Superintendent, while secondary students are dismissed for the day.

Hartman explained that in-service education for teachers was established through state legislation in 1972, making it possible for school districts to hold training sessions for teachers for a maximum of 10 days during the school year.

He said that "the purpose of in-service education is to give teachers the opportunity to become more familiar with the new educational practices and techniques constantly being developed."


Three days of elementary teacher workshops have been completed district wide.

**Your Social Security**

Q. I'm a 62-year-old widower. Since I was totally dependent on my wife before she died, can I get monthly social security checks based on her work record?

A. Possibly, if she worked long enough in jobs covered by social security. Since January of this year, the age of eligibility for dependent widowers was lowered from 62 to 60. You should contact any social security office to apply for monthly payments.

Q. I'm retired, but I still write some homemaking

Q. I just started getting social security retirement checks, and I'm thinking of doing some part-time work I don't fully understand the retirement test. Can you explain it to me?

A. Under the retirement test you can work and earn as much as \$2,100 in a year and still get all of your social security benefits for that year. However, if your earnings exceed \$2,100, your benefits are reduced \$1 for every \$2 earned over that amount.

No matter how much you earn in a year, though, you can get all of your social security benefits for any month you neither earn \$175 nor do substantial work in your own business. Next year the figures will go up \$2,400 a year and \$200 a month.

Q. I'm retired and my daughter who's a student gets social security checks. She'll be 22 next month but won't graduate from Alaska Methodist University until January. We've been told that her checks can continue until she graduates. Is this true?

write some homemaking articles for several magazines and newspapers. If I work for several months on an article and then get paid by check, does my payment count as one month's earnings or can I pro-rate the total amount over all the months I worked on the article?

A. You are allowed to earn \$2,100 a year and still get your full social security benefits. If your annual net self-employment income is under this limit, it doesn't matter how much you earn or receive in any particular month.

If your total annual net income exceeds \$2,100, the amount of time you devote to your highly skilled occupation each month can affect your social security payments. Next year, you can earn as much as \$2,400 and still get your full social security benefits.

 A. Yes. Student benefits do not always end when the student becomes 22. A full-time undergraduate student who remains unmarried may continue to get checks after the month the student becomes 22. The student's checks stop at the end of the quarter or semester in which the student reaches 22 or two months after the student's 22nd birthday, whichever comes first.

Q. Since my husband's death two years ago, I've been getting social security checks for myself and two of our three children. However, my oldest girl, who's now 24, couldn't get payments because she was over 18 when she became severely disabled from arthritis. She was 19 when her disability began. Has this law been changed?




