After six months of personal contact and letter correspondence the association feels that very little progress has been made toward improving the planning and design work on the highway projects serving, these areas.

We do not accept the position the State Highway Department is taking to restrict the growth and safe transportation of these communities with obsolete and outmoded highway designs that are years behind the times. We deserve so mething better than accessos that compare to the one at Turpin Road and Glenn Highway.

We were informed Friday that the section from 800 feet north of Artillery Road to Peters Creek will be the next section constructed.

This will result in channeling four-lane traffic into two-lane traffic just 800 feet from the present Artillery intersection.

BREAK IN REPORTED AT PARKERS DEPT. STORE


EAGLE RIVER: Alaska State Troopers apparently did not investigate a reported breakin at Parkers Department Store.

Damage to the Blazer was estimated at \$100. The Renault sustained an estimated \$30 damage.


