**LOCAL YOUTH MISSING ..... FATHER OFFERS REWARD**

**EAGLE RIVER BOY VICTIM OF  
 SNOW MACHINE ACCIDENT**

ANCHORAGE: Funeral services were held last Sunday, February 11th for David John Newman, age 16, who was killed when he was struck by a car after reportedly falling from the back of a snowmachine driven by another youth.

The accident took place at 6:40pm at Mile 15 on the Old Glenn Highway near Tips Bar.

The Eagle River Fire Station responded to the call with both the ambulance and fire engine. The fire engine crew remained at the scene of the accident to direct traffic while the youth was taken by ambulance to the hospital where he was pronounced dead on arrival.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Newman, of Juanita Loop Road in Eagle River, and an eighth grader at Chugiak Junior High. He was born on Dec-

BIRCHWOOD: The Alaskan made film, "A Time for Every Season", will be shown at the Birchwood Elementary School on both Thursday, February 15th, and Friday, February 16th, according to a spokesman for the Birchwood PTA.

EAGLE RIVER: The father of a missing 13 year old Eagle River youth is offering a reward of \$200 for the recovery of his son.

The youth is Charles Bray only son of Orval E. Bray of Mercy Street in the Debora Subdivision in Eagle River.

The boy was reported last seen on Saturday, February 3rd. Mr. Bray, who had been working in Ketchikan at the time of the boy's disappearance, said the youth had been staying at the home of W. H. Selby at Mile 17.

According to three other boys in whose company the missing boy was last reported, the four had been in the vicinity of the Sportsman's Hall at Mile 15, where a teen dance was in progress. They said that they had accompanied Charlie to the trailer where he lived with his father when the latter was at home. The trailer was unoccupied at the time, but the electricity and heat were turned on, according to Mr. Bray. He said his son had a key to the dwelling. The other boys claimed that when they left the trailer, Charlie had re-

nounced dead on arrival. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Newman, of Juanita Loop Road in Eagle River, and an eighth grader at Chugiak Junior High. He was born on December 12th, 1957 at Tooele Utah, and had lived in this area since 1959.

He is survived by his parents, a brother Steven of the family home; five sisters, Mrs. Robert Dicang of Kodiak, Mrs. Linda Mamae, of Mt. View; Mrs. Claudia Everts of Anchorage, Mrs. Pam Patti of Harvey, Ill. and Miss Becky Newman of Kodiak.

Funeral services were held at Evergreen Memorial Chapel with Robert L. Hartman of the Jehovah's Witnesses officiating.

and heat were turned on, according to Mr. Bray. He said his son had a key to the dwelling. The other boys claimed that when they left the trailer, Charlie had remained behind. They claim they did not see him again that night, and he apparently did not return to the Selby residence that night and has not been seen since.

Mr. Bray said that he was notified of his son's disappearance at Ketchikan and returned immediately to Eagle River.

The State Troopers were called in and are investigating the disappearance.

Bray said that although he has had many reports of the boy having been sighted anywhere from Anchorage to Palmer, none of them have been authentic.

Charlie is described as being 5 feet six inches tall, and weighing 135 pounds. He has light brown hair and blue eyes. When last seen he was wearing a dark green down filled parka with a patch on the left sleeve, black leather gloves and a red and white knitted head band.

The boy was an eighth grade student at Chugiak Junior High School. He has lived in the area on and off since 1969.

Mr. Bray said that his son was not the type to have run away from home, and he was not the type to have run away from home, and he fears the boy may have met with foul play.

Over the years the question of whether the Greater Chugiak Area should incorporate into a formal unit of government has come up and died for lack of direction.

Each time, many agreed that "someday" we should attempt to form some type of government, but the time was never at hand.

However in view of the ever present threat of unification, annexation, reapportionment etc. it appears that unless this area does unite into some type of incorporated entity, the time will arrive when it will not be possible (if that time has not already passed).

Every week or so some proposed plan for unification surfaces at the Anchorage level. The current one to annex the military bases may shortly become a reality. Should this come to pass it would bring the boundary of the City right up to that of the Eagle River and Birchwood areas, and make them next in line to be gobbled up through annexation.

The meeting is scheduled to start at 9:00am, and plans have been made to invite a guest speaker who will talk on a subject of interest to the group.







**ANCHORAGE:** A special trapping season to reduce the beaver population in the Portage Valley Closed Area has been set for February 1 through March 31st, the Department of Fish and Game has announced.

Paul LeRoux, area game biologist in Soldotna, said only that area which is north of the south bank of Portage Creek and Portage Lake will be opened to beaver trapping during the special season.

Trapping permits will be required, and trapping will not be permitted on beaver colonies adjacent to roadsides and visitor viewing areas.
