SCHOOL LAND SWAP AWAITS BLM APPROVAL

CHUGIAK: The exchange of land between the Chugiak Benefit Association and the Anchorage Borough School District is stalled pending approval of the exchange by the Bureau of Land Management,

The proposal to exchange the accrage at the Chugiak Carnival Grounds at Mile 21 on the Old Gleun Highway for the site presently occupied by the Chugiak Elementary School has been submitted to the BLM last Wednesday, (February 28th), and until BLM has had an opportunity to review all phases of the proposal, no final decision will be forthcoming.

A total of 1,527 voters cast their ballots at the six local precincts, a much better turnout than had been expected.

Local returns were called into the Knik Arm Courier all before 10:00pm, also a record with the abbreviated

The Chugiak Benefit Associntion would get in exchange for the 25 acres at the Carnival Grounds, the present site of the school, which would include all buildings and improvements.

The proposal which was submitted to BLM included plans for the new school as well as a detailed plan of the use that CBA would put the exchanged property to. This included the right to lease certain portions of the building with the revenue to be used to pay for upkeep of the facility.

While the package, was submitted to the Anchorage office of the Bureau of Land Management, it was said that the BLM at Washington D.C. will be the ones to render the final

A spokesman for the School District said that while the architects have been modifing the plans for the new school to accomodate the proposed Carnival Grounds site, no actual work, can begin until approval of the plan is received.


NONE HURT IN TWO CAR COLLISION







"Commercial lending institutions in the State have cooperated well with earlier federally guaranteed loan programs", State Student Loan Coordinator Jac B. Carruthers noted, "and their continued cooperation is expected."

Commissioner Lind further stated that approval of this program is particularly timely as all State Student Loan Funds have been awarded; this will give students a welcome secondary loan source.

While not quite as attractive as the State Student Loan Program, it still is an excellent secondary source with 7 percent simple interest for those who meet the federal financial need test, the interest is federally paid while attending school.

Loans are available to those not meeting federal financial need test, but for these students, and for those who do not wish to apply for an interest subsidy, there is no federally-paid interest.
