# LOCAL VOTERS SAY "YES" TO YOUNG ... "NO" TO BONDS

## SCHOOL LAND SWAP AWAITS BLM APPROVAL

**CHUGIAK:** The exchange of land between the Chugiak Benefit Association and the Anchorage Borough School District is stalled pending approval of the exchange by the Bureau of Land Management.

The proposal to exchange the acreage at the Chugiak Carnival Grounds at Mile 21 on the Old Glenn Highway for the site presently occupied by the Chugiak Elementary School has been submitted to the BLM last Wednesday, (February 28th), and until BLM has had an opportunity to review all phases of the proposal, no final decision will be forthcoming.

The purpose of the land exchange was to enable the school district to construct the

ool district to construct replacement for the Chugiak Elementary School on a site which did not have the problems with inadequate water and drainage as has been the problem at the existing location.

The Chugiak Benefit Association would get in exchange for the 25 acres at the Carnival Grounds, the present site of the school, which would include all buildings and improvements.

The proposal which was submitted to BLM included plans for the new school as well as a detailed plan of the use that CBA would put the exchanged property to. This included the right to lease certain portions of the building with the revenue to be used to pay for upkeep of the facility.

While the package, was submitted to the Anchorage office of the Bureau of Land Management, it was said that the BLM at Washington D.C. will be the ones to render the final decision.

A spokesman for the School District said that while the architects have been modifying the plans for the new school to accommodate the proposed Carnival Grounds site, no actual work, can begin until approval of the plan is received.

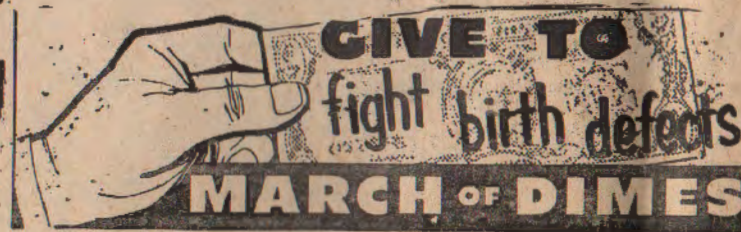
### NO INFO ON GAS THEFT AT CHS

### LOCAL MAN SHOT IN STRUGGLE WITH ASSAILANT

**EAGLE RIVER:** An Eagle River man is listed in Satisfactory condition in the 5040 Air Force Hospital after being wounded while trying to take a loaded revolver away from another man.

The victim is Harvey Kirkpatrick, of Aurora Street.

According to the Alaska State Troopers, the assailant, Bernard R. Jucha age 55 of Anchorage, went to the Kirkpatrick residence at approximately 6pm on Sunday, March 4th. He was reportedly armed with a revolver at this time.

Following what was reported as an argument at the Kirkpatrick home, a woman who the Troopers identified as Clara Wilson came out of the house followed by Jucha who fired two shots at her.

According to the Troopers, Kirkpatrick was trying to take the gun away from Jucha when the weapon discharged,

wounding Kirkpatrick in the lower abdomen.

Jucha was arrested and is lodged in the Alaska State Jail charged with assault with a dangerous weapon.

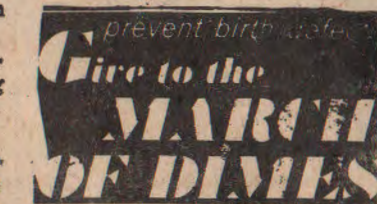

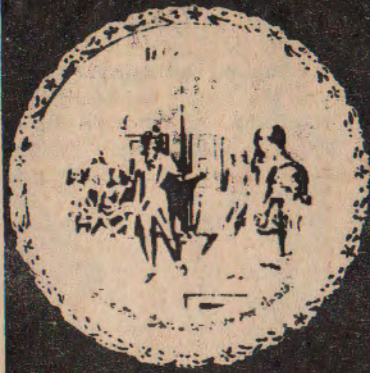

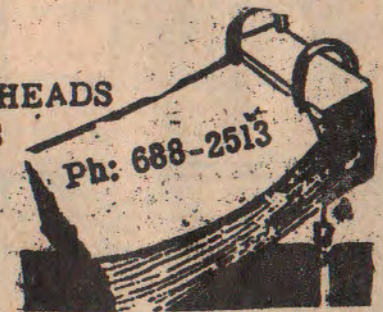
