BIRCHWOOD: Mystery surrounds the death of a young woman who was found unconscious in the middle of the North Birchwood Loop Road at 3:49am, Monday, July 23.

The victim, Linda Susan Miller, age 25 of Anchorage, was pronounced dead on arrival at the ANS Hospital after being transported there by the Chuglak Volunteer Fire Company ambulance.

She was discovered lying in the center of the road by Joe Evans, a Birchwood area resident.

According to the Alaska State Troopers, she died of an apparent skull fracture.

The incident is under investigation.

COMMITTEES FORMED TO MAP LOCAL HIGHWAY NEEDS

EAGLE RIVER: The Eagle River Improvement Association has formed several committees, who are charged with bringing the needs in highway improvement in this area to the attention of the Department of Highways and State Legislators.

Listed high in priority is the need for no less than three interchanges from the old to the new Glenn Highways in the Eagle River area.

Also the committee will push for having the Eagle River, Eagle River Loop and Birchwood Loop Roads designated as part of the Federal Assistance Highway System, (where matching funds are available) and not assigned to the Borough Road Service District.

A finance committee has also been formed for the ERIA.

There will be another public meeting of the Eagle River Improvement Association on Thursday, August 2nd, at the Sportsman's Game Preservation Association Hall at Mile 15 on the Old Glenn Highway. The meeting will begin at 8:00pm, and all interested persons are urged to attend.

TWO HURT IN CRASH AT BIRCHWOOD AIRSTRIP

BIRCHWOOD: Two men were injured, one seriously in the crash of a light aircraft at the Birchwood Airstrip last Saturday, July 21st, at 1:30pm.

According to George Fay of the F.A.A. information office, the single engine Citabria crashed while landing.

The pilot and passenger, both of Anchorage were injured. Robert C. Cace, suffered a skull fracture and a broken back. He was airlifted by helicopter to the 5040 Air Force Hospital. The other man, Laul Ladigard, was taken by private car to the office of Dr. Thomas F. Green, of Eagle River, and then transferred by the Eagle River ambulance to Providence Hospital.

It was not disclosed which man was the pilot of the plane nor was the cause of the crash.

HOT DRY WEATHER BRINGS NUMEROUS BRUSH FIRES

CHUGLAK: The hot, dry weather of the past week has resulted in several brush fires to be answered by the Chuglak and Eagle River Firemen.

On Wednesday, July 18th, the Engine II of Eagle River Fire Station responded to a small brush fire on Dawn Street at 11:46am.

Early Tuesday morning July 24th, at 5:25am, campers started a brush fire across from Spring Creek Lodge on the Old Glenn Highway. The Chuglak Volunteer Fire Company responded.

Later that day, at 1:00pm children with matches were blamed for a brush fire on 'No-Name Street', in Eagle River.



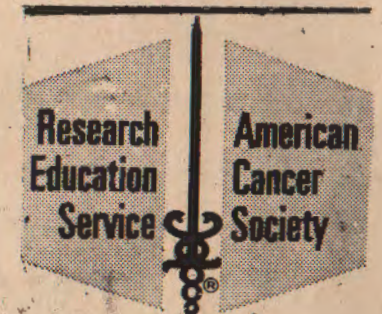
PETITIONS FOR MTA CANDIDACY

ANCHORAGE: Truck, truck-tractor and bus owners, in whose name a vehicle is registered are required to file the Federal Use Tax Returns on highway motor vehicles according to Charles E. Roddy, District Director of IRS.

The tax is imposed on certain trucks, truck tractors, and buses that use any public highway. The tax period begins July 1 and ends the following June 30.

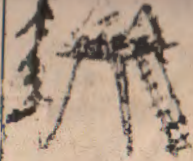

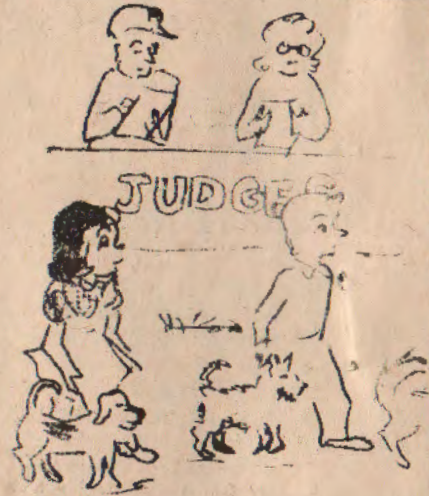

Family SHOPPING BAG

ITEM: Thanks to plenty of good and nutrition know-how, protein deficiency in America is relatively rare. Where it exists, however, here are some of the symptoms: premature aging, poor muscle tone and posture, anemia and slow recovery from illness or surgery.

ITEM: Most meats for roasting are placed on a rack in an open shallow pan. The single exception may be a beef standing rib roast, since the bones usually form a natural rack for this meat cut. Since these roasts are becoming more compact, that is, shorter, they may roast more easily when supported on a rack.

ITEM: The chuck is a good place to look for budget buys in beef. This is pot-roast territory, the site of blade, arm, English or Boston and cross rib pot-roasts. Ninety-nine pounds of pot roasts come from the chuck and over half are retailed as blade pot-roasts. Less tender than roasts from the rib section, these large cuts are best when cooked by braising which makes them tender and desirable.

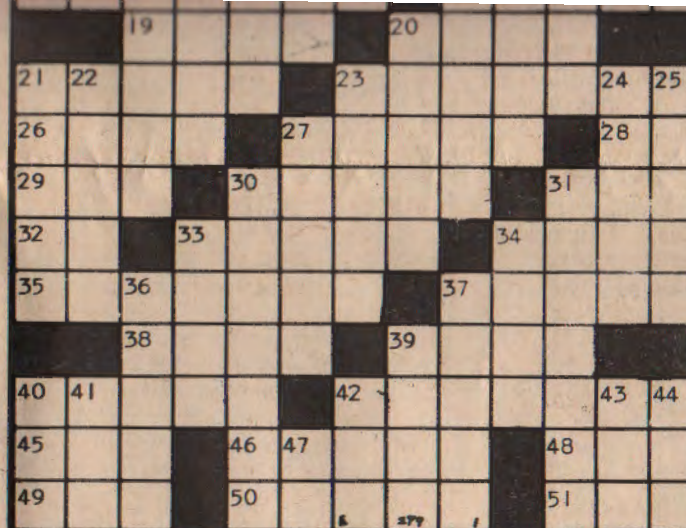

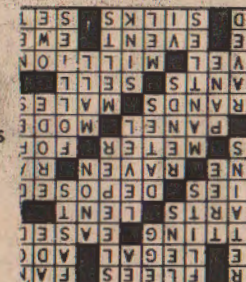
