## SURVEY TO SHOW HOW MANY FAVOR NEW BOROUGH

**OLD CHUGIAK:** A home at M<sup>1</sup> 18.5 on the Old Glenn Highway sustained extensive damage when it was struck by a car last Sunday, August 12th.

### OPENING OF CORRECTION CENTER DELAYED INDEFINITELY

**EAGLE RIVER:** The opening of the Southcentral Correction Center near Eagle River has been delayed indefinitely, according to Stanley Zaborac, director of the facility.

Nugen pointed out that in some instances, the survey takers have been unable to reach some of the numbers listed in the phone book, and he invites anyone who has not been contacted, and who

Mrs. Johnson identified the driver as Ralph Rollins, of Lower Fire Lake. He was unable to see where he was driving and therefore hit the side of the house.

The Johnson residence is located at the end of a 100 foot driveway which extends up the hill from the Highway.

The collision caved in one wall of the house, and damaged the concrete block foundation. Considerable damage was sustained to the interior of the house, including the breakage of numerous knick-knacks. A refrigerator, which was just inside the damage wall was damaged beyond repair, Mrs. Johnson said.

Mrs. Johnson said that the driver had offered to pay for all of the damage.

# NEW BRIDGE TO BE BUILT OVER KNIK RIVER

**PALMER:** A new bridge to replace the condemned one over the Knik River will be constructed according to the State Department of Highways.

The location of the existing bridge and its replacement is over the Knik River on the Old Glenn Highway near Palmer.

Advertising for bids will begin immediately. The work will consist of construction of a 500 foot composite box girder bridge with a 28 foot roadway width, and grading, drainage, and hot asphalt pavement on 0.46 miles of approaches.

All work is scheduled for completion within 276 calendar days.

Bids will be opened in the Commissioner's office in Douglas on September 27th, 1973, according to a spokesman for the Department of Highways.

## PALMER MEN ARRESTED IN DRUG RAID

**PALMER:** A month long investigation into drug traffic in the Palmer area led to a grand jury indictment last week and the subsequent arrest of seven persons on charges of sales of drugs.

Troopers identified those arrested as Patrick L. McKenzie, 21; William J. St. Pierre, 18; Michael W. Fitzgibbon 19; Jayson N. Dearborn, 24; David A. Charon, 19; Richard a Hodsdon, 21, and Donald K. Cook, 18, all of Palmer.

They were charged with sale of marijuana, cocaine, LSD and opium. Troopers said they also recovered a large quantity of various drugs during the course of the arrests.

### Twin Nectarine Angel Cakes

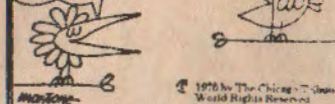

| 1 package (14½ to 16 oz.)<br>angel food cake mix | margarine                                   |
| ½ cup sugar                                      | ½ cup lemon juice                           |
| 3 tablespoons cornstarch                         | Few drops yellow food<br>color (optional)   |

| 1 cup water                                      | 1 cup whipping cream,<br>whipped, sweetened |

Prepare cake mix as package directs; turn into 16 x 4½ x 4-inch angel food loaf pan. Bake in 375 degree (moderately hot) oven 30 minutes. Invert pan and cool cake thoroughly. (Raise pan by resting corners on inverted custard cups if it has no legs to lift it up from table surface.) To remove from pan, loosen edges of cold cake with thin spatula. Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt in saucepan; blend in water. Cook, stirring constantly, until thickened and clear. Remove from heat; stir in butter, lemon juice and food color. Slice nectarines. Split cake lengthwise into 2 layers. Arrange half of nectarine slices on bottom layer; spoon half the lemon glaze over slices. Cover with top layer. Cut into 2 loaf cakes, each 8 inches long. Spoon remaining glaze over 1 loaf; arrange half of remaining nectarine slices on top. Frost top and sides other loaf with whipped cream; arrange remaining nectarine slices on top. Chill until

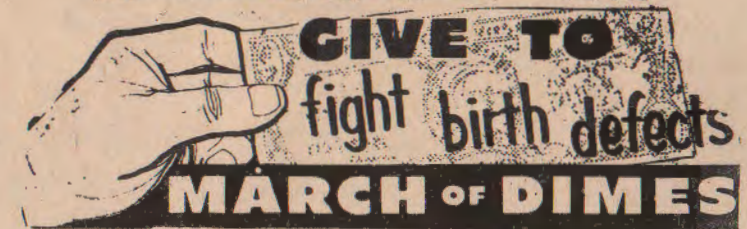

### FISHING IS CLOSED IN THREE VALLEY CREEKS

**PALMER:** ~~Several~~ low salmon runs in the Alaska Department of Fish and Game will announce closure of three small Matanuska Valley streams effective at midnight tomorrow August 10th.

The streams include Fish Creek near Goose Bay, Cottonwood Creek, near Wasilla, and Wasilla Creek (including Rabbit Slough), near Palmer. Closure will stay until further notice, although fishing will be resumed if enough salmon enter the creeks.

Both silver and red salmon runs are lagging far behind seasonal migration patterns in each of the streams, Larry Engel, area biologist at Palmer has said.

A department counting weir on Fish Creek has shown the system's red salmon run to be the poorest on record.

The silver salmon count there is but a fraction of that normally enumerated by this time, Engel added. All salmon remaining are needed for spawning.

Information collected by Fish and Game confirms the belief expressed by several long time Valley Fisherman that all three creeks are getting very poor silver runs. Engel went on to say.

Many anglers have had unusually low catch rates at Cottenwood and Wasilla Creeks in recent weeks.



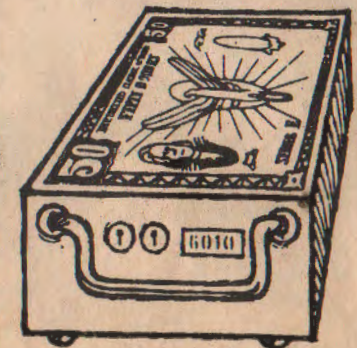
